



An FSA can help you save on health care expenses

Sign up for a health care flexible spending account (FSA) to help pay for eligible health care expenses you may have during the year. You'll save because you won't have to pay taxes on the money you set aside.

See the tax savings

As an example, the Gonzales family puts \$2,000 into their FSA. See how their tax savings add up:

\$500	+	\$153	+	\$100	=	\$753
25% federal tax saving		7.65% payroll tax saving		5% state tax saving		The family's total FSA tax savings ¹

Use your health care FSA for expenses like these:

- Acupuncture
- Blood sugar test kits and insulin for diabetics
- Chiropractor visits
- Dental services like cleanings, fillings, X-rays and braces
- Doctor's office visits and X-rays
- Drug prescriptions
- Health plan deductible, coinsurance and copayments
- Hearing aids and batteries
- Laboratory fees
- Lasik eye surgery
- Vision services like exams, eyeglasses, frames and contact lenses

Covered over-the-counter medicines (with a valid prescription):

- Acid controllers
- Acne medicine
- Allergy and sinus medicine
- Cold and flu medicine
- Eye drops
- Ointments for cuts, burns or rashes
- Pain relievers, such as aspirin or ibuprofen
